Financial Report: The Financial Report Item #2 was presented by Martha Smith. Account

balances are as follows:

Checking:

\$8,936.04

Money Market: \$14,988.95

Shares:

\$60.42

It was discussed that after expenses are paid for the 2013 Annual Meeting, all but the amount needed for "operating" will be transferred to the Money Market account plus \$500. It was thought that a

checking account with a large balance might throw up a red flag to the IRS, and we want to make sure we do not have to pay taxes.

Proposed Budget (Item #3): - the only large change for this coming year will be in travel for the Executive Board for the state meeting. It will be in Kill Devil Hills, NC and some will have to come in on Tuesday, so that will be an extra night.

It was agreed that "Board of Director meeting refreshments" should come off the proposed budget, since it is reimbursed based on receipts and is an "in and out". As far as the association budget is it neither revenue nor expense.

Geri Bushel suggested that since we have so much money might we consider giving money to the state meeting host district to defray costs of the meeting in order to reduce the cost per individual. It was noted that the State Association already gives the hosting district \$1000; it's intended use is for professional speakers.

Another item discussed included a possible moratorium on state dues.

After all the discussion the following changes were made to the Proposed 2013-14 Budget:

Under Revenue/Other Contributions – remove "County Operations – BOD Meeting Refreshments" (\$100) to make Total Revenue \$8,460.

Under Expenditures:

Change "Awards" to "Awards and Recognition" Under "Other" – remove "Miscellaneous" (\$100) This will make Total Expenditures \$8,460

Martha Smith read a letter to the Executive Board she wrote regarding an accident and findings of checks in the checkbook that occurred in August. Please see Item # 4. The books have been audited since the findings and no irregularities or problems were found. The audit letter is filed with the Treasurer's information.

Old Business:

1 Archiving Financial Records: Martha Smith gave a report (Item #5) on the status on Archiving Financial Records since the last Executive Board Meeting in February. It was discussed what was considered to be Financial Records because several Board Members was confused that it was Check Registers, Statements, etc. Martha specified that she was talking about the items that are saved to a jump drive and is passed from treasurer to the newly elected treasurer. The jump drive has Proposed Budgets, Financial Reports and all other documentation of the treasurer from years past. Tracy stated that the items on the jump drive did not need to be put on the Association's

website and that the reports that are given in Business Meetings are included in the secretary's minutes. Geri Bushel suggested the Google Docs or a Drop Box that the documents can be placed in and shared with the following treasurer so they are somewhere else besides the jump drive should something happen to the jump drive. Martha stated that was a recommendation in Item #5. After the discussion on what financial documents Martha was referring to be archived it was settle she was referring to the jump drive and not the bank statements that was decided in February at the Executive Board Meeting to still be received through the mail and to with online banking. Martha confirmed that the bank statements were still being received in a hard copy format. Geri asked "Why did the association no have online banking?" Tracy replied that in order to have online banking the association would have to have a debit card. Tracy stated her concerns with having an active debit card. She stated the by-laws for the association state that for each transaction there has to be two signatures of approval and with the debit card a transaction can be processed without the signatures. Martha confirmed that at one time the association was given a debit card that was never activated and has been shredded and therefore since it was never activated the online banking not available without an active debit card. After much discussion on how to archive the the bank statements Tracy recommended that the treasurer still receive the paper copy in the mail and after balancing the accounts the statement be scanned and placed in Google Docs and then the paper copy is to be shredded. ACTION: The Executive Board decided that ALL Financial Records would be place in Google Docs or a Drop Box, whichever the treasurer would like to use, in order to archive and would be shared from old treasurer to new treasurer.

2 TERESSA Dues: Tracy stated that in the last Board of Directors meeting in March a letter from TERESSA President, Debi King, was read and the letter requested that TERESSA Dues be included on the NCCEAPA Dues Form. Tracy stated that a voted did not be needed because it was voted to include the TERESSA dues on the NCCEAPA form but she wanted to present the updated form (Item #6) to the NCCEAPA Executive Board to look over and make changes. ACTION: After discussion on what changes to make, the Executive Board made the following changes: #6. Numbers of Paid Active TERRESA Members.

Remove: Does your District/Campus have 100% Membership? Yes/No, Remove: If no, how many members remain unpaid/declined joining, and made a few grammatical errors.

New Business:

- 1. **Honorary Membership:** Tracy stated that the Chair of the Membership Committee, Susan Winebarger, gave her the nominations and they are as follows: Ruth Ann Pope, Vicky Merritt, Vicki Pettit, Devona Wooten, and Rebecca Ritch.
- 2. Executive Board Award: Jane McDaniel reported there were 7 nominations.

- 3. **Herter-O'neal Scholarship:** Sandy Kanupp reported across the state she received 77 nominations. Four applications were submitted onto state and the winner was Frank Miller from Surry County. Sandy said the applications were great and made the decision very hard.
- 4. Sue Mills Lighthouse: Tracy reported there are 7 nominations but one nomination had to be removed due to the guidelines. Tracy presented the Nominating Information & Procedure Guidelines for this Award (Item #7). She noted that on page two of the document the two arrows are items that need to be discussed. The second bullet under the selection committee states: A NCCEF representative. Tracy state that the North Carolina Cooperative Extension Foundation has voiced that they no longer want to part of awards or receiving awards packages. Therefore, Tracy asked "Who needs to replace them on the selection committee or do they need to be replaced?"

The next arrow states (bullet 4): Note: Members of the selection committee are not eligible for nomination. If said person is the Chair of the committee (President), he/she must turn over the reminder of this process to a member of the committee, to execute the rest of the President's duties until the winner is announced at the annual state meeting.

After much discussion Sandy suggested the incoming President, Jane McDaniel create an ADHOC committee to look and make changes to the Sue Mill's Lighthouse Award Information and Procedure Guidelines and the Executive Board members agreed.

- 5. APA Search for Excellence Award: Tracy reported there were 8 nominations. She stated the nominations are low. She said that a lot of awards that have the word Excellence in them and she is afraid people are seeing it so much and ignoring the request for the applications. She suggested changing the names to some of the awards so they don't all run together. Sandy said she would look into changing the name for the award for next year's process to see if that would help bring in more applications.
- 6. **2013-14 Slate of Officers:** BJ Okelshen, Nominations Chair, provided Tracy a list of the slate that would be brought to the Board of Directors and voted on by the membership in the NCCEAPA Business Meeting. They are as follows:

In late August, a cup of coffee turned over on my desk and thoroughly soaked the NCCEAPA checkbook, check carbon copies and register. Unwritten checks that remained in the checkbook were numbers #828, 829 & 830. The remaining carbon copies of check and check register were not salvageable.

I started writing checks on the next sequence and inadvertently picked up #931 instead of #831 as the next sequence. Two checks were written in this sequence; check #931 (on 8/12/13) and check # 932 (dated 8/15/13).

When I realized the error in sequence, I put the 931-series back and looked for the 831-series. Checks 831-870 were not present in the materials forwarded to me at the beginning of this fiscal year. I started writing check with check #871 and this is the current series being used. I researched bank statement back to October 2004 and no checks had been written out of sequence during that time period.

The NCCEAPA bank accounts have been audited by a Senior Accounting Specialist at Wake County Human Services and no problems or irregularities were Identified. This audit letter is filed with the Treasurer's information.

FINANCIAL SECREATARIES REPORT

Archiving Financial Records — At the February 2013 Executive Board Meeting it was proposed to discontinue transporting 5-years of printed bank statements to each newly-elected Treasurer and access the bank statements and check writing online, as suggested by a Loan Officer. This idea was presented for discussion to the Executive Board and was not favorably received since it would require the association to have a debit card to this account. Therefore, this proposal was not pursued.

Other ideas presented were off-line storage of back-up information: several programs were researched and all would range between \$100 - \$250 per year for service charge. This would insure a defined level of security.

Currently, all financial records are archived exclusively to a jump-drive which is transferred with the new Treasurer.

Since NCCEAPA has a newly updated website, these recommendations are presented:

- 1. Per suggestion of the bank representative, if we are still receiving printed bank statements, they should use the address of the Extension Office of the current Treasurer instead of the person's home address.
- 2. Utilize the University website for online retention of minutes and memos.
- 3. Archive and Retention of Financial Information:
 - Utilize the Google-Drive in Google mail. This information can be entered on any NCSU email system and shared with specific officers / members.
 - b. Depending on the security of the university website, archived financial reports can be stored there also.




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Sue Mills "Spirit of Light" Lighthouse Award

Award Introduction/History





Sue Mills began her career at NC State University with Extension Forest Resources as a Typist III in 1973. In 1980, Sue moved to the Department of Extension Sociology and Anthropology, where she was a Secretary IV for 3 years. From 1983 until her retirement, she served as the Administrative Assistant for County Operations.

Sue was an outgoing person and never met a stranger. She loved NC State, Cooperative Extension, and the people that we serve across the state. She was an integral and valuable part of County Operations and its mission to support our County Extension Centers statewide. Sue possessed great organizational skills and believed in the abilities of her co-workers across the state. She was known for her "take charge" ability and if she didn't know an answer to a question, she knew who did.

The beach was a favorite place to visit and she enjoyed her vacation home along the Pamlico River. She loved to collect lighthouses, and they were a prominent theme in her home, her office, and at her retirement celebration.

Sue served in the following positions in the NC Cooperative Extension Secretaries Association (NCCESA) - Campus Chapter:

- Treasurer, 1992-1993
- Professional Improvement Committee Chair, 1995-1996

Sue received the Award for Excellence from NC State University in 1999 and the NCCESA Executive Board Award in 1994. She was also recognized in "We Salute" during 1993.
