- provide inspiration to the NCCEAPA and members of the NCCE community by virtue of their leadership, service, and high ethical standards
- support and advocate for NCCE and NC State and NC A&T State Universities

EXECUTIVE BOARD AWARD

The NCCEAPA Executive Board Award is presented annually by the Executive Board to an outstanding NCCEAPA member.

The award is based on NCCEAPA:

- participation
- contributions
- cooperation

Any NCCEAPA member is eligible to nominate any member of the Association. It is not limited to those who have served as officers, but it should be someone who has exhibited outstanding loyalty and dedication to the Association.

SUE MILLS LIGHTHOUSE AWARD – SPIRIT OF LIGHT

Sue Mills began her career at NC State University with Extension Forest Resources as a Typist III in 1973. From 1983 until her retirement, she served as the Administrative Assistant for County Operations. Sue was an outgoing person and never met a stranger. She loved NC State, Cooperative Extension, and the people that we serve across the state.

Sue's death in 2001 created a void for those that knew and loved her that will never be filled. It is our desire that this award keep her memory and her spirit with us always and that it serve as an inspiration to our members. This award is made possible from memorial gifts given in memory of Sue A Mills. Her family, knowing her love for our organization, designated North Carolina Cooperative Extension Secretaries Association as the recipient of these gifts.

Selection of the Sue Mill Lighthouse "Spirit of Light" award winner will be based on the nomination narrative. Criteria for the award should include how and why the nominee has been an inspiration to you and how the individual has made a difference within the organization. Leadership qualities, enthusiasm, and zest for life should be included because this award is designed to recognize an individual who has made a difference.

NCCCEAPA PROFESSIONAL IMPROVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP

Open to Members of the North Carolina Cooperative Extension Secretaries Association (NCCESA) for the purpose of professional development to enhance job and related skills (continuing education through college, certification, workshops or seminars, etc.).

- an applicant may only receive one scholarship per year
- amount per scholarship and number of scholarship(s) will be determined after the applications are reviewed and at the discretion of the Professional Improvement Committee.
- course of study or workshop/seminar must be job related.
- information (i.e. brochures, programs, etc.) regarding course of study should accompany application.
- scholarship(s) monies shall be utilized by recipient(s) within one year

HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

The Chair of the membership Committee will present recommendation to the Board of Directors who, after two-thirds vote, shall recommend the candidate to the Association at an annual meeting. A majority vote of the members assembled shall be required to confer the honor. An Honorary Member shall pay no dues except where he/she is an Active or Associate Member.

Recommendation for members and nonmembers shall be made in writing to the Board of Directors using the following guidelines:

- Cooperation
- Participation
- Contributions
- Leadership
- Approval by district members
