## NCCEAPA Executive Board Meeting - May 19, 2022

Durham County Center Training Room, 721 Foster Street, Durham, NC 27701

President Beth Cloninger called the meeting to order at 1:11 p.m.

Secretary Kareis Britt called roll; all were present. A voting quorum was verified by Parliamentarian Christine Barrier.

President Beth Cloninger emailed agendas and printed copies for attendees; the agenda was approved after a motion to accept from LaToya Lucy, with a second from Kareis Britt.

Minutes from the September 21, 2021 Executive Board meeting, posted on the NCCEAPA website, were approved with no changes after a motion to accept from Christie Bell, with a second from Beth Cloninger. Minutes from the April 7, 2022, Executive Board meeting were emailed to members, and were approved with no changes after a motion from Christie Bell, with a second from LaToya Lucy.

**Membership forms/dues payment to include TERSSA** – Minutes from 2021 Executive and Board of Director meetings reflect there had been some discrepancy between previous statements by then-treasurer Brandy Proctor over removing TERSSA dues from the membership forms. Dues for TERSSA were not included on 2021-22 membership forms and were left up to individual districts or members to collect and turn in. NCCEAPA rules and bylaws do not address the Treasurer collecting dues; however, the Treasurer's timeline/working papers reflect TERSSA dues should be collected by district treasurers and submitted to the state treasurer during the annual membership drive. It was decided TERSSA dues would be added back to the membership forms and collected by district treasurers to remit with NCCEAPA dues, and the state treasurer would cut one check to TERSSA for membership dues. As there are no stipulations in the rules and bylaws, and no vote was taken to remove them originally, no vote was needed.

**Campus Chapter dissolvement** – Campus Chapter has officially dissolved as of April 18, 2022, via email sent to President Beth Cloninger (attached). To date, no members have joined surrounding respective district associations. Nominating committee has notified the West district of rotation change for 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President nomination. State meeting rotation will be updated as well, with the West district hosting 2024. Evelyn Stahling was contacted and is still listed on the account for the Campus Chapter. Evelyn agreed to close the account and forward remaining balance to the state treasurer upon receipt of formal request from the NCCEAPA. Rules

and Bylaws do not dictate how funds from dissolved chapters should be handled when members absolved by active chapters/districts. For the time being, funds will be held by the State Association.

**NCCEAPA logo** – New logo design ideas are being worked up by a graphic designer. Several designs should be ready to present to the BoD at the September State meeting; upon approval from BoD, the final design will be voted on at the September business meeting by the general assembly. Winning design will be unveiled at the 2023 State meeting as part of the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration. NCCEAPA will cover the cost of having the logo digitized so it can be used for printing, embroidering, etc.

**Financial Report** – Maryann Mickewicz presented the financial report (attached); copies were provided with the agenda. Question about filing taxes (state and districts) was raised, and it was noted that taxes should be filed on balances over \$9999. Discussion on how to spend the excess in the State Money Market account resulted in suggestions to provide \$500 donation to the community service project of the district hosting the state meeting, and enhancing the HON scholarship by increasing the winning applicant's amount to \$1000 and providing \$250 scholarships to the 4 district winners that did not win the state scholarship. These recommendations will be presented to the Bod at the May 20 meeting.

NCJCEP Report – No report at this time.

**2023 State Meeting Update** – Roben Jarret presented the update from the SE District Steering Committee (attached).

**TERSSA Report** – Christine Barrier presented the TERSSA report (attached).

**Herter O'Neal Scholarship Award** – Roben Jarrett reported applications were received from each district, with the winner coming from the SC district; winner will be announced in the report to the BoD at the May 20 meeting. Recommended that essay portion of application should be increased from 50 words or less as it carries the weight of importance on deciding the winner. There was discussion on the word limit, and it was decided that 300 words or less would provide adequate space for applicants without overburdening judges. This is an increase from the "100 words or less" recommended in the report that had been distributed to the BoD prior to the May 20 meeting, and will be presented orally at said meeting.

**Other New Business** – Beth received a request from the FCS National Association requesting financial support for their National Meeting, being hosted by North Carolina for the first time in 23 years. Discussion resulted in the suggested donation of \$1000 and the offer of support from nearby members during the meeting. This will not be able to be presented to the general assembly for a vote as the FCS meeting takes place prior to our state meeting. Beth Cloninger made the motion to present recommendation to BoD for approval, with a second from Christie Bell; the motion was approved by majority vote.

Ideas for the upcoming Extension State Conference trainings and classes offered for Admin and COSS staff were asked for. Discussion on how to get new and current members more involved in both district and state Associations suggested not knowing what responsibilities were required of officers, committee chairs, and standing committees might make members fearful of accepting nominations or participating. After discussion, it was decided the current Executive Board could present a session outlining duties and responsibilities of NCCEAPA officers, committee chairs, and committees so members would be aware and hopefully be encouraged to participate more. Also mentioned was a training on Word Press Extension websites. Both will be brought to the BoD for approval at the May 20 meeting, with requests for additional ideas.

President Beth Cloninger called for any other new business, and with none cited, motion to adjourn meeting was made by Roben Jarret with a second from Kareis Britt. Meeting was adjourned at 3:30 p.m.

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
