Finance report presented by Maryann Mickewicz. Question was raised about the funds from Campus Chapter after dissolving and what was being done with them. Maryann stated they were marked, and being held in the state funds. Question was then raised as to why the funds had not been dispersed to chapter absorbing two previous members, and it was pointed out there were no active paid members from Campus chapter at the time they dissolved (April) or when funds were discussed at the Board of Directors meeting in May; if they joined later, it was not brought to the Executive Board's attention, and the decision had been made to hold funds until the current membership drive numbers were in to see if any members joined surrounding chapter, and funds would be dispersed accordingly once that information was available. Recommended this issue should be turned over to Rules & Bylaws committee and amendments made to address how funds are handled when no members are current and active in a dissolving chapter.
